elebrating and reflecting the unique and diverse ways food is enjoyed in Singapore is the annual Singapore Food Festival 2002 this April. Visitors and locals alike will be treated to trays after trays of appetising international cuisine and hearty local fare from a total of 50 events. Take a walk down the food lane with us, as we highlight some of the mouth-watering treats that await you.

FLAVOURS OF THE WORLD

An Asian banquet is up for the take at The Asian Village Experience in Downtown East (1 Pasir Ris Close). Tuck into exotic regional dishes such as spicy Indian curries, Middle Eastern kebabs, fresh Japanese sushi, and delectable local favourites like laksa and chicken rice, at more than 60 food outlets. Apr 5, 2-10pm; Apr 6-7, 11am-10pm. Free Admission.

If you have a penchant for anything hot and spicy, Chilli Festival, beckons you. Cooking up a fiery storm at Fort Canning Park, the event focuses on chilli dishes from around the world, with fun games like the Chili Eating Contest adding to the fanfare. Apr 12-13, 5pm-9pm; Apr 14, 11:30am-9pm. Free Admission.

Can't get enough of American fodder? Saunter your way down to the Entertainment Atrium at Suntec City (3 Temasek Blvd.) for American Jamboree. The weekend feast includes favourites from eateries such as Hooters, Planet Hollywood, Bobby Rubino's and Lawry's The Prime Ribs. Apr 19, 5pm-10pm; Apr 20-21, 10am-10pm. Free Admission.

For a taste of traditional Chinese food, stop over at Chinatown Food Street for the Flavours of Good Old Chinatown. Dine on bona fide Chinese dishes alfresco style, and take in the sights and sounds of the district once populated by early Chinese immigrants. Apr 26-28, I lam-10:30pm. Free Admission.

DINE WITH ANIMALS

A food fiesta with animals has always been a favoured alternative dining choice among many visitors to Singapore. You, too, can experience a wild meal during the festival. At For a detailed lineup of events, call hotline 6278-2467 Jurong BirdPark (2 Jurong Hill), have a Breakfast with the

Birds, as you munch on roti prata (Indian pancakes) prepared in various new and exciting ways - from cheese prata to banana prata to kimchi prata. Apr 1-30, 8:30am-10:30am.

Other options at the BirdPark are the award-winning Dinner with Penguins or Polynesian Fare by the Shore. The latter lets you dine against a glass-viewing

> gallery with a view of the Waders exhibit where spoonbills, ibises, herons and gulls inhabit. Apr 6 and 13, 12:30pm-3pm. Dinner with Penguins is as its name implies - feasting among 200 black and white birds. Apr 19 and 26, 7pm-10pm.

Over at the Singapore Zoological Gardens (80 Mandai Lake Rd.). Buuna with Baboons serves up Ethiopian coffee and cuisine, while Hamadryas baboons and herds of ibexes gather on a hillside nearby. Apr

6, 13, 20 and 27, 3:15pm-5:15pm. The award-winning program, Lunch with the Lions, allows you to indulge in a sumptuous buffet beside a lion enclosure. Apr 7, 14, 21 and 28, 11:30am-2pm.

When night falls, hop onboard a moving safari tram and enjoy a candlelight dinner. The Gourmet Safari Express is held at the Night Safari next to the zoo. Apr 5 and 26, 6:30pm-10pm.

Dolphin lovers will surely lap up to Picnic with Pink Dolphins on resort island Sentosa. Savour nonya cakes and desserts by the beach, while pink dolphins entertain with sky hops, tail walk and flip flop moves. Apr 7 and 14, 10:30am-noon.
